For the 2018-19 school year, schools were identified using definitions and labels as required in the Every Student Succeeds Act (ESSA). A Targeted Support and Improvement (TSI) school is one that has at least one underperforming student subgroup. An Additional Targeted Support (ATS) school is one that has a student subgroup performing at the same level as the lowest 5% of all schools in the state. A Comprehensive Support and Improvement (CSI) school is one whose performance is in the lowest 5% of all schools in the state or has a graduation rate at or below 67%. Some schools are not identified with any of these labels. In these cases, no label is given.

Through the school improvement process, we have identified achievement gaps and are implementing a variety of strategies to increase student achievement. A continued focus will be on students with disabilities and students in the bottom 30%. School-wide reform strategies, such as Thinking Maps, Academic Enrichment and Differentiated Instruction, will continue to be utilized by all teachers.

PROCESS FOR ASSIGNING PUPILS TO THE SCHOOL - All district pupils in grades 4 - 7 are assigned to Farwell Middle School since there is only one building in this district that serves this grade span of pupils. Students may also be assigned to this building for a program offered that better meets their educational needs.

THE STATUS OF THE 3-5 YEAR SCHOOL IMPROVEMENT PLAN - A copy of the School Improvement Plan is available at the school web site: www.farwellschools.net/middleschool and a paper copy can be accessed in the middle school office. The School Improvement Team, composed of several focus groups, meets regularly during the school year. The purpose of the team is to develop, review and evaluate goals, objectives and

strategies for the School Improvement Plan. The School Improvement Team facilitates the continuous collection and analysis of academic assessment data to guide instruction and evaluate progress toward student achievement goals.
