### March 2020

Census invitations mailed to households

### April 1, 2020

Census Day nationwide

### April - July 2020

Reminder letters/postcards sent if no response received

### May - August 2020

Census Bureau employees visit households that have not responded

### December 31, 2020

Census Bureau delivers count to President and Congress

- Completing the nine questions ensures our schools, roads, hospitals and libraries receive their fair share of federal funding
- The Census Bureau is committed to keeping your information confidential, private and secure; by law, individual-level census information cannot and will not be shared with any agency
- Items like name, gender, age, birthday, race, ethnicity, phone number and relationship to head-of-household/owner/renter are asked on the census
- Census forms are filled out by household; everyone living at the address matters and everyone needs to be counted, including children
- You can respond online using the unique Census ID that will be mailed to you; if you don't have internet access, you can respond by phone or mail in March, 2020
